


You should start arriving at 5:00pm. Food will be served at 5:30pm.



After a dinner break, Wolf Island Band played. Jerry Diaz and The **Reef** then finished the evening with a crowd favorite: Here's to you,






Here's to me. Here's to taking life easy. Fill my glass to the top, and raise it high. We don't work out,
